Elements of Non-Fiction

THESE NON-FICTION FEATURES ORGANIZE THE BOOK AND HELP READERS KNOW WHAT IS IMPORTANT

Captions: Help you better understand a picture or photograph

Comparisons: These sentences help you to picture something

Example: A whale shark is a little bit bigger than a school bus.

Glossary: Helps you define words that are in the book

<u>Graphics:</u> Charts, graphs, or cutaways are used to help you understand what the author is trying to tell you

Maps: help you to understand where places are in the world

<u>Illustrations/Photographs:</u> Help you to know exactly what something looks like

<u>Index:</u> This is an alphabetical list of ideas that are in the book. It tells you what page the idea is on.

Labels: These help you identify a picture or a photograph and its parts

<u>Special Print:</u> When a word is **bold**, in *italics*, or <u>underlined</u>, it is an *important* word for you to know

<u>Subtitles:</u> These headings help you to know what the next section will be about

<u>Table of Contents</u>: Helps you identify key topics in the book in the order they are presented
