

RL.7 - Standard Nine - Compare and contrast a **fictional portrayal** of a time, place, or character and a **historical account** of the same period as a means of understanding how authors of fiction use or **alter** history.

1. Fictional portrayal – (noun) the author’s interpretation of a time, place, or character which is unable to be proven. The time, place, or character may be totally made up or based on an actual element but cannot be proven.
2. Historical account – (noun) a narrative about a time, event, place, or character from the past and can be proven.
3. Alter – (verb) to make something different from what it once was; to change.
