

SMART Goals #4

To be considered SMART, a goal must have the following characteristics: Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, and Timely.

Specific – Be very clear! “Get an A” is not clear, why?

“Do not speak out at all” is not clear why? Be clear and concise.

Measurable – How will we know if you have met your goal? What data will be used to measure it?

Attainable – Is your goal achievable? Be sure to make your goal one that you can achieve in a timely fashion.

Relevant – Does your goal fit with the activity? If asked to make a goal for volleyball, you would focus on that activity, not what you might be doing in science class.

Timely - Remember to fit the goal to a logical time-structure.

Using the SMART Goals Worksheet, create one SMART goal for your literature class that you will complete by the end of the first nine-weeks.

Your goal will be graded based on whether your goal meets the five characteristics listed above.
